Steps for Implementation: Social Skills Groups

Social skills groups may be used to teach a variety of social behaviors In the evidence base, social skills group training targeted perspective-taking, conversation skills, friendship skills, problem-solving, social competence, emotion recognition, theory of mind, and problem-solving

Social Skills Training Model

- Current focus on Social Skills Training for vets with SMI 3 Background of SST
- Identified as an evidenced-based practice for persons with serious mental illness
- Currently used in multiple research projects - Vocational social skills - Reduction of substance use

Tip Sheet: Social Skills Training (SST)

Many social skills curricula are organized around these skill domains Rationale Social skills have been considered an “academic enabler, “which means that students with more developed social skills are more successful in the classroom (eg, pay better attention, ask questions, consider the view points of others; DiPerna & Elliott, 1999)
